

ASK Protocol


- 1. Do it right.

Food (hunting, fishing, gathering, growing)


Shelter, clothing, tools and baskets

Culture, language, history, art, traditions, laws and stories


Economy (services, surplus trade and sale)





GUIDING PRINCIPLES

- 1. Empower community youth through the implementation of the CRP
- Incorporate traditional knowledge, customs and practices within the implementation of key CRP actions
- 3. Care for the mental and physical well-being of all members to support personal and community well-being
- Proactively adopt climate resilience and environmental design principles into community projects and programs
- 5. Implement its Title and Rights to advance the community's overall resilience and serve as caretakers of the Territory.
- 6. Promote a meaningful community engagement process to support the "by Kanaka, for Kanaka" model.
- 7. Collaborate with government agencies to advance the community's interests and meaningful reconciliation.




